Rockland County is conveniently located along The NYS Thruway. It connects to Westchester County and New York City to the south and east via the Gov. Mario M. Cuomo Bridge, Albany and Canada to the north, and the rest of NYS to the west. The Palisades Interstate Parkway provides north/south access through Rockland County (exits 4 – 15) and provides easy access to New York City via the George Washington Bridge.
