First United Methodist Church (The Creek Church)

Known as the Creek Church from its proximity to the Cedar Pond Brook, the First United Methodist Church is the oldest congregation in the Town of Stony Point. Organized in 1804, its current structure was built in 1882 and was rebuilt after a fire in 1909 destroyed the interior.

Organized in 1877, this is the oldest Jewish congregation in Rockland County. Rabbi Elimelech Adlin lost his life in the disastrous Haverstraw landslide of 1906 while assisting others. The first synagogue was dedicated in 1899. Damaged by fire in 1966, it was replaced by the current structure.

Directions to Rockland

Located just 30 miles north of New York City, Rockland County is easily accessible via the New York State Thruway (1-87/I-287). It's a quick drive for those coming from New Jersey and Connecticut.

The Governor Mario M. Cuomo Bridge and Bear Mountain Bridge span the majestic Hudson River and lead visitors into Rockland County and provide scenic views of Rockland's dramatic, rocky cliffs that tower over the Hudson's waters.

The Palisades Interstate Parkway provides north/south access through Rockland County (exits 4 – 15) and connects southbound travelers to New York City via the George Washington Bridge.
