

## Historic Cemeteries

Mt. Repose Cemetery Westside Ave. & Rte. 9W

Haverstraw Publicly established as a cemetery in 1853, it includes the graves of early setters of Rockland, writer, and adventurer Leonides Hubbard, composer Kurt Weill and his wife, actress Lotte Lenya. Adjacent to Mt. Repose are Congregation Sons of Jacob

26 Richard St., Sloatsburg This is a settlement-era burial ground associated with the development of the community of Sloatsburg and includes the Sloat Family Burial Ground, Earliest burial is that of Private Iacob Sloat shot and killed during the American Revolution, 1781

Clarkstown **Mount Moor African** American Cemetery Palisades Center, Cemetery Ln & Palisades Center Dr. West Nyack

Deeded in 1849, it was called

the burying ground for colored people until 1986. Of the more than 100 people buried here are veterans from the Civil War to the Korean War, including Civil War veteran Lafayette Logan of Massachusetts's 54th Regiment.

Oak Hill Cemetery 140 N. Highland Ave. (Rte 9W).Nvack oakhillcemeterynyack.com Dedicated on June 27, 1848, it reflected a change from

small family and religious burial grounds to commu cemeteries. Graves include founders of Nyack, playwright Charles MacArthur and his wife, actress Helen Hayes, scientist and inventor William Hand, and artist Edward Hopper.

**Rockland Cemetery** 201 Kings Hwy., Sparkill rocklandcemetery.org

The cemetery was created in 1847 by Eleazar Lord, author educator and first President of the Erie Railroad. Buried here are the veterans of the Civil War and later wars: John Charles Fremont, the Pathfinder: engineer HenryHoneychurch Gorringe; and local physician Dr.
